

Demos Assail Nixon's Charge of Isolationism

WASHINGTON (AP) — Democratic senators reacted sharply Wednesday to President Nixon's criticism of what he called the

new isolationists who have declared "open season on the armed forces."

Sen. J. W. Fulbright, chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee, said the tone of Nixon's Air Force Academy speech in Colorado Springs was "very ominous" and portions of it were personally offensive.

In other statements— Sen. Gaylord Nelson, D-Wis., said the President's speech gives "the unfortunate implication that those who are vigorously opposing the ABM and questioning defense boondoggles are unilateral disarmers and new isolationists."

'Readjust Priorities'

Sen. Alan Cranston, D-Calif., said: "I know of no responsible American who advocates that we alone lay down our arms. What is sweeping America is a demand that we readjust our priorities and our goals so that we tackle the immense problems we face at home and abroad with realism and not with rhetoric."

Fulbright accused the administration of hindering a peace settlement by refusing to relinquish control of South Vietnam.

The Arkansas Democrat said the President's references to new isolationists, advocates of unilateral disarmament and critics of the military "offended me very greatly."

"I believe this misrepresents critics such as Symington and myself," Fulbright said. "I believe this is a distortion of what we are saying—we're critical of the political judgments, not the individual military."

Sen. Stuart Symington, D-Mo., a former secretary of the Air Force, has emerged as a leading opponent of defense policies.

Fulbright's remarks came in testimony before a joint economic subcommittee investigating the military budget and in an impromptu news conference in a Senate corridor.

He said he interpreted the President as saying America will continue in its role as a sort of world policeman.

"It's the thrust of his thinking that is very ominous," Fulbright said. "He's almost on all fours with the previous administration. It's absolutely poor judgment."

Fulbright accused the President of painting critics as somehow unpatriotic.

Strike Curbs Rejected by British Unions

LONDON (AP) — The Trades Union Congress (TUC), representing nine million workers, overwhelmingly rejected Thursday the British government's plans for curbing wildcat strikes and voted by an equally wide margin to set up its own system for bringing discipline to the nation's chaotic labor relations.

Meeting in emergency session in suburban Croydon, the TUC delegates flayed the government for allegedly trampling on the basic right of trade unionists to strike.

The bloc vote was 8,252,000 against the government's projected legislation to 359,000 for it. The vote to authorize the TUC to set up its own system of judging disputes was approved by 7,908,000 to 846,000.

Government Condemned

The vote came after a long day of debate in which many union leaders filed to the rostrum to condemn the government.

Prime Minister Harold Wilson had agreed to delay introducing the bill in Parliament until after the emergency TUC assembly, the first in 49 years and the second in the federation's 100-year history.

The delegates were particularly incensed about the part of the bill providing for a mandatory 28-day "cooling-off" period before a wildcat strike, with legal action and fines against violators. Unionists called these "penal clauses."

Syria to Establish Ties With E. Germany

DAMASCUS (UPI)—Syria recognized East Germany Thursday and agreed to establish full diplomatic relations, Damascus radio announced.

The decision was announced in a communique issued at the end of three days of talks between East German Foreign Minister Otto Winzer and Syrian Foreign Minister Mustafa Al-Sayyed.

Syria became the fourth non-Communist country, after Iraq, Cambodia and the Sudan, to recognize East Germany.

Tape Has McCain's Son Praising Red Doctors

SAIGON (UPI)—The son of the U.S. commander in the Pacific said that despite bombing civilian targets in North Vietnam he has received "very good medical treatment" since being shot down, according to Radio Hanoi.

Navy Lt. Cmdr. John S. McCain III, downed over North Vietnam 20 months ago, was presented as saying Wednesday in a taped broadcast that North Vietnamese doctors performed an operation enabling him to walk again.

McCain, who reportedly suffered a broken leg and arm when he ejected from his jet, is the son of Adm. John McCain Jr., commander of U.S. forces in the Pacific theater, which includes Vietnam.

The English-language broadcast monitored in Saigon was one of a recent series from American prisoners in North Vietnam.

beamed into South Vietnam by Radio Hanoi.

The series apparently was initiated in response to Defense Secretary Melvin Laird's May 19 statement that there were "serious questions" about whether U.S. prisoners were receiving humane treatment.

"I have bombed the cities, towns and villages and caused injuries and even death for the people of North Vietnam," a voice identified as McCain's said in the broadcast.

"After I was captured, I was taken to a hospital in Hanoi where I received very good medical treatment. I was given an operation on my leg which enabled me to walk again and a cast on my right arm, which was badly broken in three places."

McCain, who was shot down in October 1967, is one of an estimated 300 to 600 American airmen being held in North Vietnam.
